

WHERE DO THE SCHOLARSHIPS COME FROM?

Because of the generosity of donors, the Heart of Illinois Community Foundation awards up to 70 scholarships each year to high school seniors who have been accepted at accredited colleges, universities, or trade programs in the United States. These awards total well over \$120,000 in educational financial support. Endowed scholarship funds help students long after the donor's lifetime.

Scholarship awards vary in size from \$500 to \$10,000, and length (from 1-4 years).

# HOW DO I KNOW IF I'M ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

### Scholarships are awarded based on criteria, including but not limited to:

- Residency (Macon, Piatt, or Moultrie County)
- High School Attended
- Academic Excellence
- Financial Need
- Community Service / Involvement
- Personal Essay, Additional Essay (as applies), Letters of Recommendation

Some scholarships are also connected to the pursuit of specific careers or majors (i.e. agriculture, business, engineering, education, science, trades, etc.)

WHEN AND HOW DO I APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

The online scholarship application portal is open to graduating seniors from **January 1 - March 1**. The application is online ONLY, accessible via our website at *heartofillinois.org* (no paper or printed applications will be accepted).

The application requires personal and academic information, FAFSA/SAI score, essays, qualifications (transcript, activities), letters of recommendation. Many of these items can be completed and prepared ahead of time.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

After the **March 1** (11:59 PM) deadline, the scholarship review process begins with nearly 100 volunteer committee members reading and evaluating the applications based on related scholarship criteria. High School Counselors are notified of recipients in April, and scholarship notification letters are awarded at high school award ceremonies or mailed to the recipients' home address (those not receiving an award will be notified in the month following). Scholarship payments are sent directly to colleges/universities or trade schools in July/August (pending completion of the required award acceptance and follow-up form by recipient).
